#### **Taunton Castle**


Taunton Castle has had a very exciting couple of weeks. In English, we have been continuing the story *The Wind in the Willows*. The children are writing letters as one of the characters from the story. They are writing to a friend explaining all of the adventures that *M*r Toad has got himself into. They are remembering to set their letter out correctly and include addresses, paragraphs and remembering to keep their writing in the first person.

In maths, the children have been recapping how to add and subtract using the

column method. They have now become quite good at this and we are ready to move on to our new textbooks after the Christmas holidays. As usual, we have been practising our times tables online and also using the more traditional methods of reciting and problem solving.

The children have been enjoying their topic of farming in their geography lessons and have been finding out all about farming in our local area. They know the difference between



arable and pastoral farming and know that Somerset produces more cider apples than any other county in the UK. They have also contrasted our farming methods with those used in South Africa.

The whole school had a lovely visit to Paignton Zoo. Taunton Castle class loved seeing all of the animals and trying to spot where some of them were hiding. It was a very successful trip and I am very proud of all of them. Have a very Merry Christmas!



#### **Bath Place**

What a fantastic last month we have had, and we are looking forward to our last couple of weeks before Christmas! We have had fun making Christmas snowmen (which will be on sale at the Christmas fayre) and have been getting fully engrossed in our Science experiments... not to mention our exciting trip to the zoo!

In Science, we have been learning about the human circulatory system. The children have tested how the blood is pumped around the body and explored how the nutrients are absorbed from the small intestines into our blood. They have learnt about the four components that make up our blood and what happens when the heart pumps blood around our bodies.

In Geography, the children have been naming countries in the seven continents using atlases and Google Maps. We looked at what Brexit means and the impact it has had on our country. The class compared England and France, focusing on both human geography and physical geography. We have understood what connections we have with France.

In RE, the children have learnt all about Christianity, in particular what 'Emmanuel' means. Moreover, we have explored what it means to Christians that Jesus came and lived among them. We have compared Christianity's God to the God of other faiths.

We have learnt about the French artist, Henri Rousseau, analysing his paintings and using these as a basis for creating their own art pieces. Bath Place have explored tonal variation and used water colours in their own creations.

We have learnt all about fractions in Maths: how to find equivalent fractions, convert mixed numbers to fractions, add and subtract fractions and compare fractions. We will continue to learn about how to multiply and divide fractions on the lead up to Christmas.

In English, the children are learning how to write persuasive letters. I'm sure you already know this, but they can be very persuasive when needed! ;-) They have analysed letters and found the features of persuasion in them and then applied these to their own letters. Over the next couple of weeks, the children will be writing an information text based on the book *How Kids Celebrate Christmas Around The World*.

#### **Vivary Park Nursery**

I can't believe there is only one more week of this term! We have had a very busy week celebrating Christmas and have another week to come. We have been doing

lots of messy and glittery crafts and creations. The children have been enjoying dressing up, wrapping up boxes and decorating our Christmas tree in our Christmas corner.
